Municipalities Responsible for Adopting and Amending Welfare Guidelines

Statutory Requirement of Local Governing Body per RSA 165:1,II "every town or city in the state shall adopt written guidelines relative to general assistance". Guidelines shall include but not limited to:

- Process of Application for General Assistance.
- Criteria for determining eligibility.
- Process of various laws, including application of rents per RSA 165:4-b, RSA 281-A:2 Workers Compensation for workfare clients, RSA 167:82,VIII for Qualified State Assistance Reductions, etc.
- Adoption and amendments should reflect reasonably current community basic need costs, including housing.

NHLWAA Process for Recommending Changes to NH Municipal Association Model Welfare Guidelines

- May 2020 Model Welfare Guidelines Committee created to review and update 2012 NHMA Model Welfare Guidelines.
- Committee presented their recommendations and the NHLWAA Board approved on 10/1/20.
- NHLWAA President provided the attorneys of NHMA with the update recommendations with a plan to present the completed Model Welfare Guidelines in June 2021.
- Attorneys of NHMA reviewed and approved the Welfare Model Welfare Guidelines.

Welfare Guidelines include Updates to New Laws and Regulations Since Last Approval

- General Assistance eligibility and practice update for APTD/OAA recipients per 2014 RSA 167:27 change.
- Expected agency payment of "current bill" to "average bill" for utility assistance/payment arrangement eligibility per 6/9/2020 NH Public Utility Commission change.
- Ability to access \$2000.00 from deceased bank account for burial/cremation expenses per 8/20/19 RSA 165:27-a change.

Updated Model Welfare Guidelines also include

- Housing and Shelter definitions and references.
- Application Process to include alternative options for interviews/appointments.
- Disbursement to include local finance policies, including municipal credit card usage when needed.
- Child age change for Job Search expectation, as RSA 165:31 reflects lower age for "Workfare" and not job search for paid employment.
- New names/acronyms, including SNAP for Food Stamps, NHMA for Local Government Center, etc.
- Example/Model Application and Forms.

Model Welfare Guidelines include More Guidance and Clarification

- Adding the Pending Decision as a limited formal use decision option.
- Adding more guidance for Home Visits.
- Adding "Maintained" definition in Legal Standard and Interpretation.
- Adding language regarding Emergency Shelter referrals, applicant refusals and involuntary exits for shelter rule/policy violations.
- Adding guidance per RSA 611-B:25 regarding Unclaimed Bodies from medical examiner.
