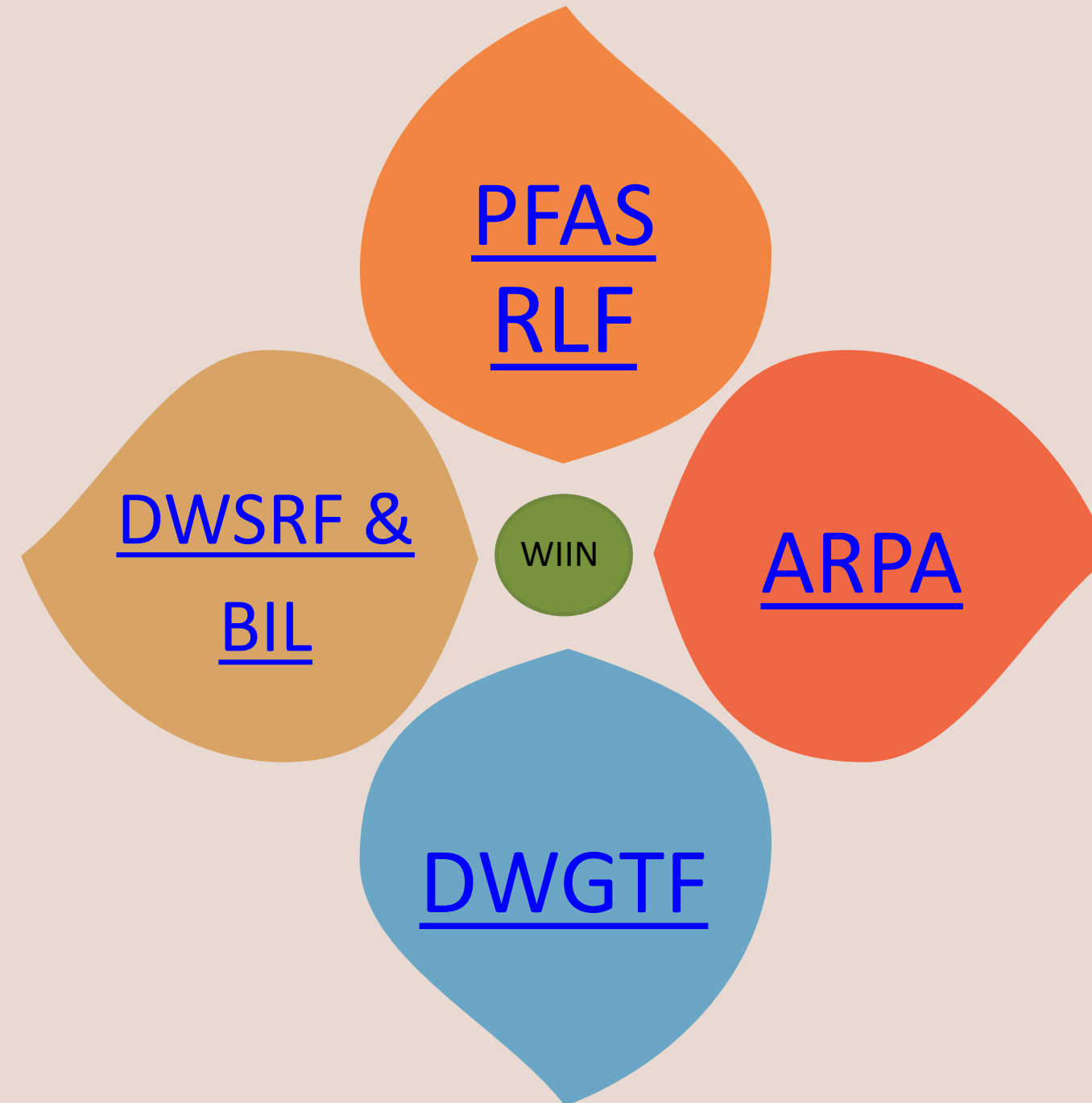

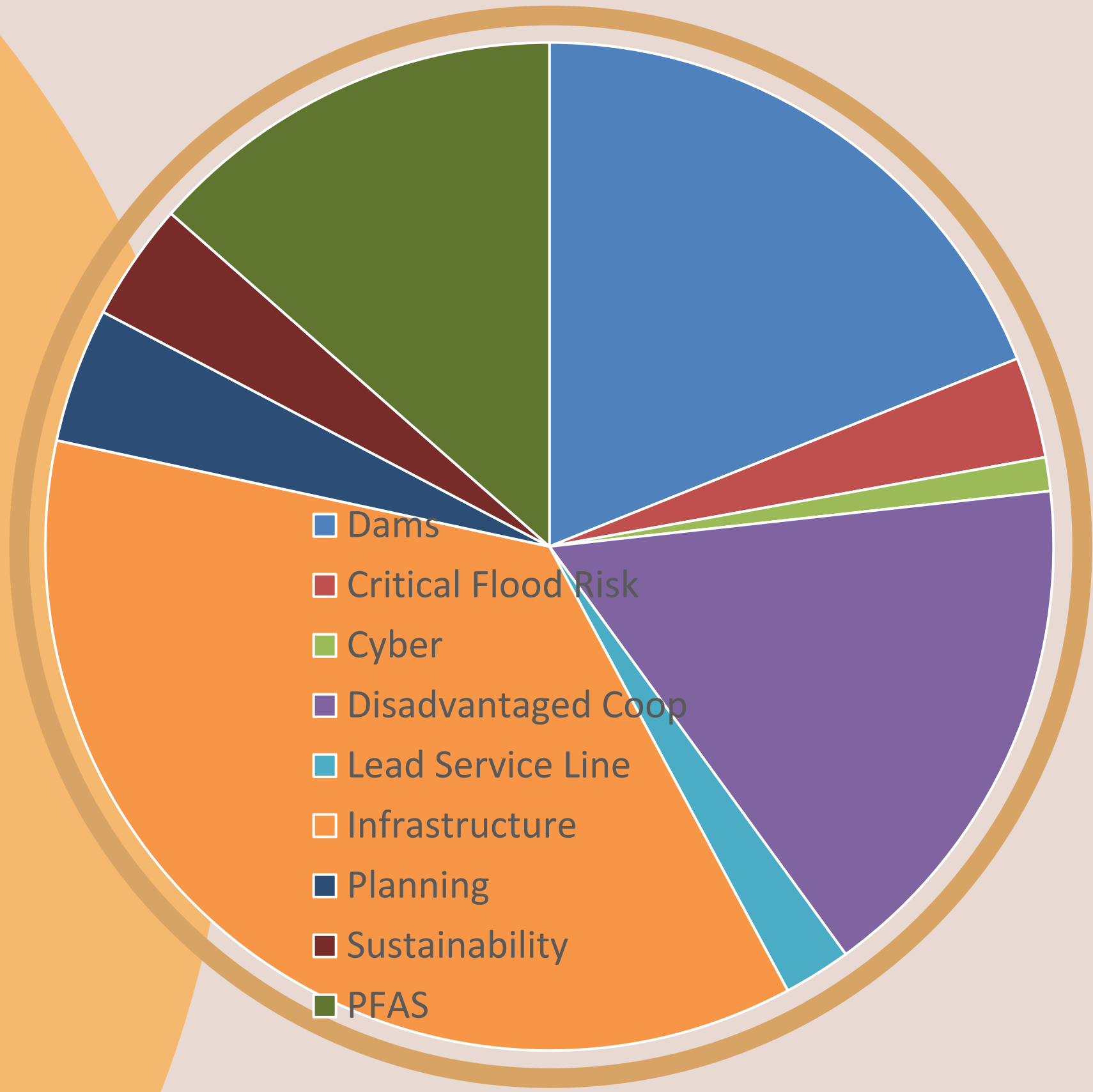
# NHDES ARPA FUNDING



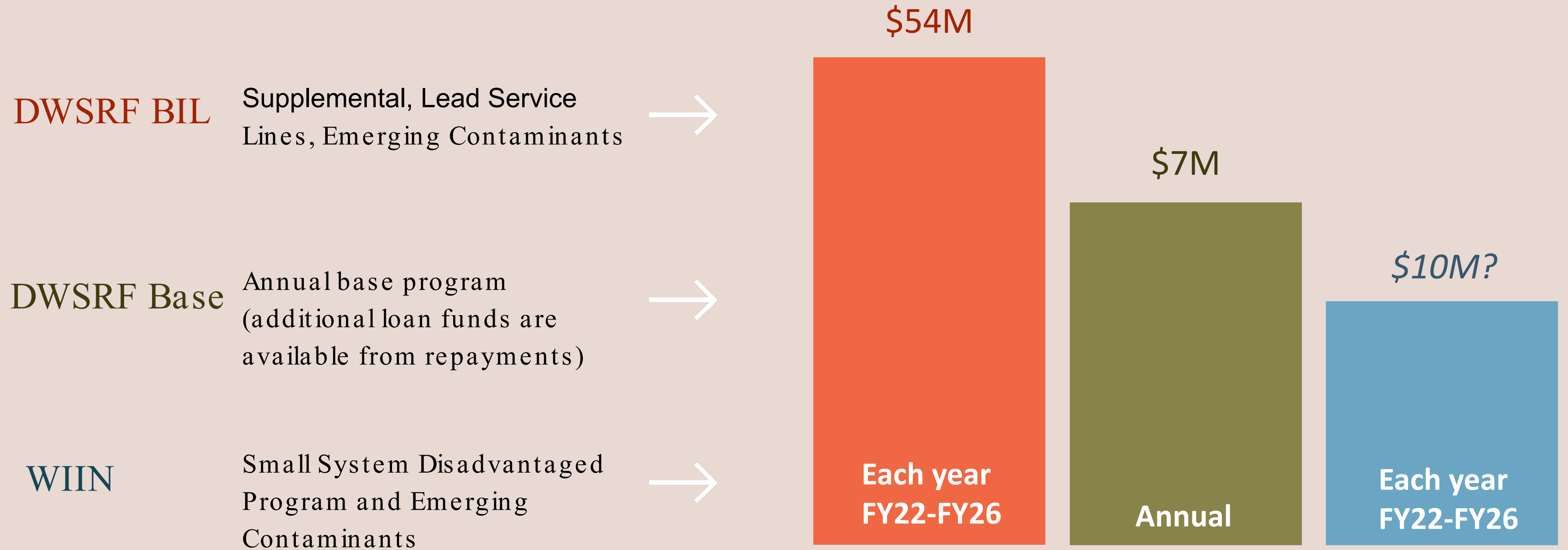
\$185,000,000

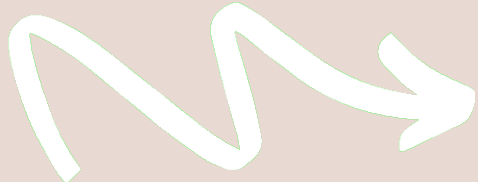

## WAND

Water Assistance for Natural Disasters Program for Low-Income Residential Well Owners experiencing a loss of a safe, reliable source of drinking water at their primary residence. Activities associated with improving or replacing the homeowner's well or connecting to a CWS.

## Consolidation Study

## Assistance Program

Small systems to identify & evaluate the feasibility and cost-effectiveness of connecting to another CWS so that systems can make informed decisions regarding the best long-term options.

## Drinking Water Construction

## Project Assistance Programs

Grants and loan for drinking water infrastructure projects. Annual and special project funding rounds.

## Source Water Protection

## Grant Program

Funding to permanently conserve water supply lands through land acquisition and conservation easements. Grants cover up to 50% of eligible project costs with a maximum grant award of \$500,000.



# PFAS FUNDING

FUNDING IS FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE

## PFAS Removal Rebate Program for Private Wells

Rebates up to \$5,000 for the installation of PFAS treatment (POU or POE or up to \$10,000 for a service connection to a PWS.

## PFAS Remediation Loan

### Fund

CWSs whose testing of untreated source water shows confirmed exceedance of the state MCLs for PFAS. Grant and low interest loans.

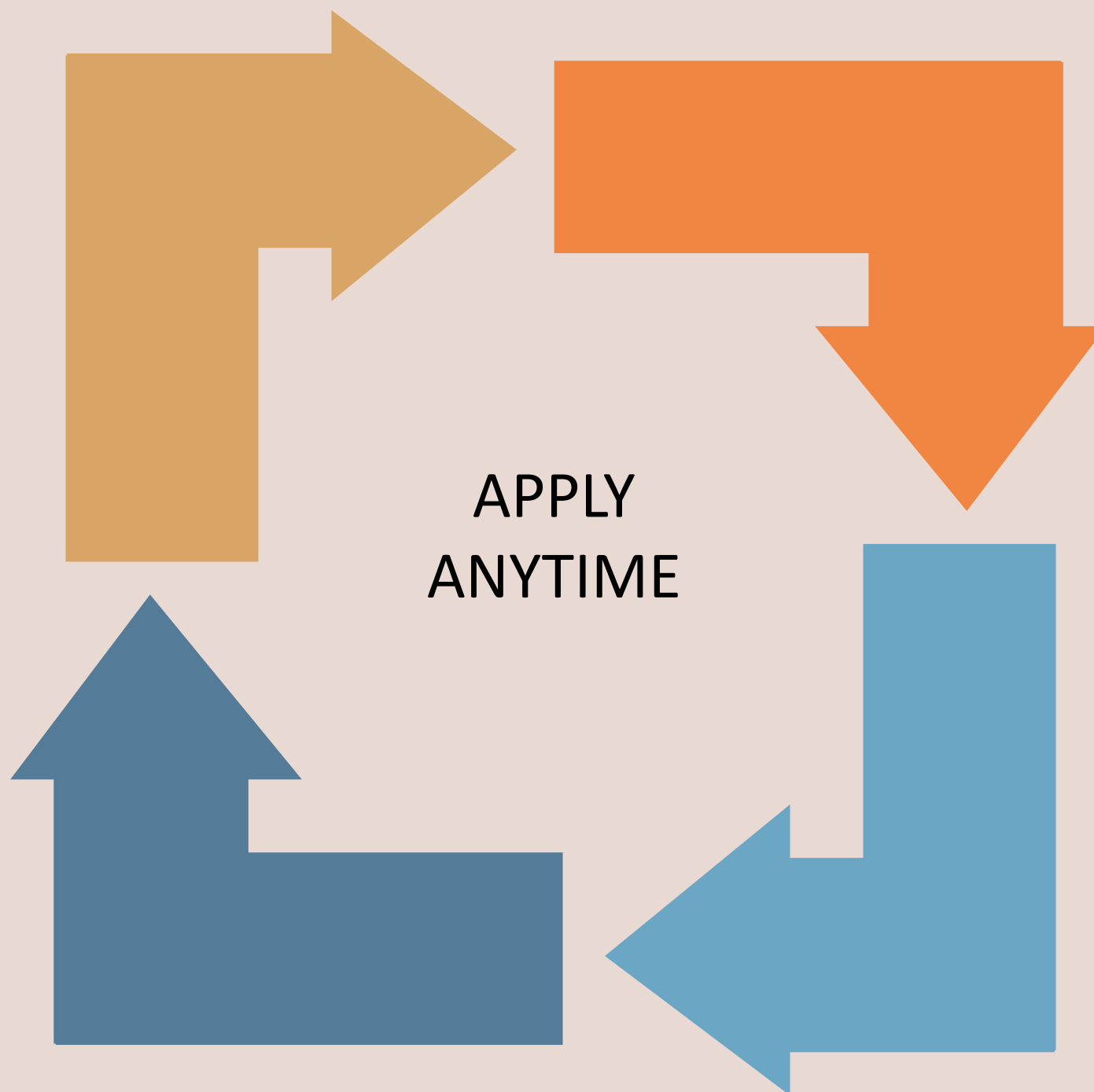
## PFAS Consolidation Study Program

CWSs serving up to a 1,000 people and not for profit, non-transient PWSs. Reimbursement for the completion of a consolidation study to evaluate the available alternatives for PFAS.

## PFAS Design Services

### Reimbursement Program

Schools, childcares, transient PWSs, and non-transient PWSs. Reimbursement for PFAS treatment design services up to 26% of the total cost of the project that pertains to PFAS remediation.
